- Hibiscus petals

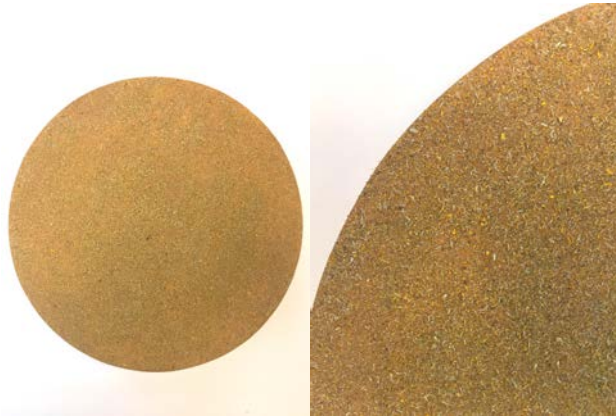
**Description:**

Meg Webster has created a series of monochrome works pigmented with organic materials found at the park as a special limited benefit edition for Socrates Sculpture Park. The circular wall relief is made of wood with a crisp beveled edge to create a round surface which appears to float off the wall, evoking a celestial body. The edition is available in 10 variations of distinct materials and colors from raw "pigments" created out of natural elements from Socrates Sculpture Park.

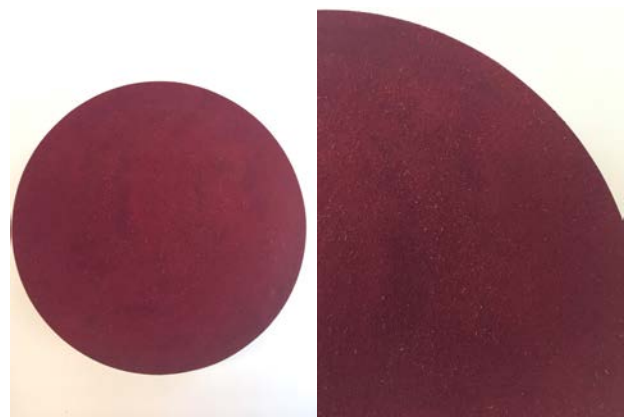
The edition is a combination of several forms and works Webster has created in the past using natural elements and minimalist geometric forms. The work also references Webster's large-scale circular earthwork, *Concave Room for Bees*, which she created for Socrates' 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary exhibition, LANDMARK and recreated at the ARoS museum in Denmark. Some of the pollinating flora originally planted in this monumental piece and later transplanted into the park's raised plant beds, have ended up as crushed pigment for this edition. Returning to the iconic circular form and the natural materials for which she is known, Webster creates a new meditation on our natural environment and our planet's ecosystem.

Meg Webster is represented by Paula Cooper Gallery, has exhibited her work throughout the United States and internationally over a thirty-year career and has artwork in many museum collections including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York and the Walker Art Center, Minneapolis.

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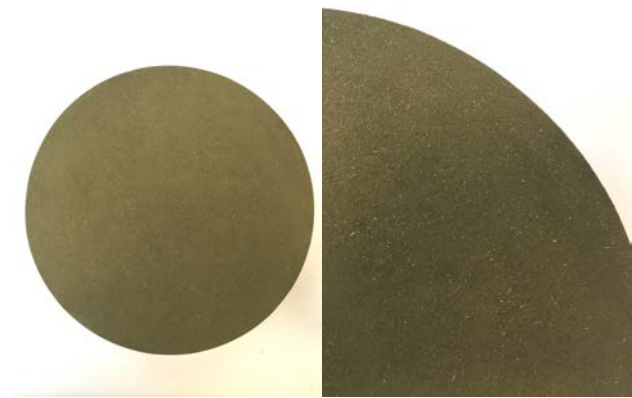
